# Lok's Offering

I hope this edition of the Samaj newsletter finds you well. After September 11th the ideas and experience of a "Happy New Year" are muddled for me. However, pressed by 9/11, caught in a family reorganization, and tumbled by the stuff of life, I do find my relationship with Babaji reaching new clarity. I want to share a bit of this clarity, knowing though that we all have our own journey and relationship with the "Simple Father" – one that is mostly beyond the ability of words to capture.

For years after encountering Babaji, I imagined that I had arrived and would at some point "get it" or "have it handled" – whatever. I loved how Babaji made the spiritual journey the most enthralling and passionate thing I could be about in my life. What I appreciate now, more than before, is that the journey is home. There are no "time outs" no "completions", no "well, that's in place". The journey just keeps being me thumping my forehead saying: "Why didn't I get that before?"; "where was this book six months ago?" – like that.

Babaji is and remains my GURU. My – gee! You are you! I wanted to turn Him into an idol. He is not available. In the end, the photographs, mantras, aarati, and community all bring me back to being more fully aware of the goodness of each moment and my presence in it – my breath, my body, and the kind of space I have created around myself.

I went to India for Fall Navratri in October, after being away for seventeen years. I felt blessed to reconnect with the rhythm of Navratri and the beauty and peace of Haidakhan. I felt renewed by reconnecting with Shri Muniraji and my Babaji brothers and sisters.

My biggest joy in doing the work of the Samaj president is to share spiritual journey with you. My intention for this column is to do just that. Please write to me about the issues

The annual meeting for the American Haidkahan Samaj was held in August in Crestone at the Haidakhandi Universal Ashram. It was a weekend full of seeing old friends, meetings, chanting, fire ceremonies, discussions, and ceremony. The president, Ellen Levand, opened the meeting and welcomed all that were in attendance. During the meeting we honored Paul Gessler, our former Secretary of the Samaj, who passed away during the summer. His wife, Abigail was present and she was given a plaque from the Samaj in his memory. After the business meeting, Ellen Levand was honored with a plaque for her many years of service as President of the Samaj. Receiving many thanks

and a round of applause, she turned over the office of President to Lok Nath, who closed the meeting with a few words about service.

### **A Workshop on the Sacred Fire Ceremony (Havan)** *with J.D. Marston (aka Ram Dass ) and Lok Nath*

This long-awaited workshop sponsored by the American Haidakhan Samaj will take place the week of August 4-10 at the Haidakhandi Universal Ashram in Crestone, Colorado and run concurrently with the Children's Week activities. (See article on page 5.) The week will provide each person with an opportunity to explore and experience the profundity of living with the sacred fire. Two of Babaji's personally trained yogis, Ram Dass and Lok Nath, who served and lived in the Dhuni in Haidakhan for several years will be conducting the workshop.

During the week, instructions will be given on how to conduct a personal fire ceremony at your home. Direction will also be given for assisting in large havan preparations at an ashram or center. There

will also be a slide show on the origin, significance, and practice of the havan ceremony in India. Each morning participants may attend a small fire ceremony before aarati. On Thursday, August 8 there will be a large havan for the new-moon observance as well as a large havan on Sunday, August 11 for the completion of the Annual Samaj Meeting weekend. This will give all attending, a hands-on experience of what they are learning.

If you have wanted to incorporate a small sacred fire ceremony into your personal spiritual practice, this would be an excellent opportunity to do so. A suggested offering made to the Samaj for the workshop would be \$54. Please call the Ashram at 719-256-4108 to make reservations.

## Navaratri in India by Lok Nath

## News from the Haidakhandi Universal Ashram

There has been so much happening at the Ashram that it is hard to know where to begin. The summer was the busiest ever with many new visitors as well as many returning friends. We served 100 people at several of our ceremonies and bhandaras. Weekends were particularly full with as many as 200 visitors in one weekend.

For the first year we had a children's week at the beginning of August. Five children and their parents (or grandparents) were here. The children participated in aarati, karma yoga, arts and crafts projects, pujari-helper training, percussion class, hikes, horseback riding, swimming, and softball. All in attendance seemed to think it was one of the best ideas of the year and are looking forward to coming back next summer.

During the summer and fall we had many groups visit from around the country. Some of them included seminar groups, school groups, family groups, and spiritual groups. This is a great way for folks to get to know the Ashram. It is not unusual for several of the participants to come back on his or her own for a longer stay at the Ashram

In October we celebrated a most beautiful Fall Navratri honoring the Divine Mother for nine days. Each day's fire ceremony and other functions were well-attended and full of devotion but the most outstanding day was definitely the final one. The fire ceremony and the feast that followed were huge. About one hundred people were served a

wonderful Indian feast that was prepared by many loving hands. Another highlight of the last day was the honoring of the children. This year we honored twenty-four children. Each child is given a crown, a veil or sash, necklace, bracelet, treats, flower, money, and served lunch. It is so sweet to see them all dressed up like little kings and queens.

The special event of the month of November was the beautiful Diwali (Festival of Lights) celebration. After our morning new-moon fire ceremony, we set hundreds of candles inside the temple and earthship, as well as along the Ashram walkways. As the sun set, the candles were lit and aarati began.

Following aarati we began singing songs honoring the Divine Light. We were grateful to have a strong representation of several of the spiritual communities and paths in Crestone. After a few Sanskrit chants,

the Carmelites sang a moving song. This was followed by a Sufi chant led by members of Sanctuary House, and a Japanese chant led by members of our new Shumei group. The energy continued to build as we were led in a Hopi song and several other songs and chants. We finished with a chant to the Divine Mother and some silent meditation focusing on Divine Light and world peace. Coming together in prayer and song for world peace and light at this pivotal time in our world's history felt very important and very strong.

December found Prem and I traveling to India. We spent a week in Rajasthan with Shri Shastriji and his family. At 94 years old, his body begins to slow down but his mind is still very brilliant. His love for the Divine Mother and Baba is so overflowing!

We then spent a wonderful five days in Delhi at the Paduka Puja. It was magnificent in every respect. Babaji's Padukas (sandals) came from Haidakhan with Shri Muniraj, Mansingh, and all the devotees. Together we sang aarati, bhajans and participated in havans each day.

We then headed for Haidakhan where we spent a beautiful Christmas. Shri Muniraj was there for four days and it was very special to spend some quiet time with him. His peaceful energy and love is so profound. The weather was great and although the Western population was pretty low because of the world situation, they estimated over 3,500 people at the bhandara on Christmas day.

We spent two days at the Holland Ashram on our way to and from India. It was great to see Pujari, Mahadevi, Raguveer, Shivani, Bhuri, Bhuro, Kharkuli and several other long time devotees. The Ashram in Holland runs very well and is most beautiful.

Since the last report, we have celebrated the Fall Navaratri (Oct. 13-21) with unseasonably warm weather, performing the Havans in the outdoor Dhuni the

I want to share a story about a time when Babaji really helped me through a challenging experience.

I was getting ready to give birth to my daughter, Juliet. I had prepared a spot right next to where I would be laboring with Babaji's picture and a picture of Haidakhan. In the previous months, I had been visualizing Babaji and the healing waters of the Gautama Ganga numbing my body so that I



could labor naturally. During the beginning of labor, I asked my doula (labor assistant) to hold me during a contraction. As she held me I prayed, "Please Babaji – I want YOU to hold me." Instantly Babaji was there – holding me in His arms. It was as if my doula had turned into Babaji. He was so strong and

comforting. I almost burst into tears. I was overcome, awed, and full of gratitude.

Later on, the contractions were becoming more and more intense. I almost started to feel out of control so I decided to turn my focus on Babaji's photo. Instantly, I felt calmer and more grounded. I locked eyes with Him for almost two hours. He was so there for me. His gaze was so strong and His comforting presence enabled me to breathe with the contractions and flow with them. I felt as if He was telling me, "You can do it – I know you can do it." My daughter was born healthy and happy, just a few hours later.

This experience brought home for me how Babaji is always there for us, no matter what. All I needed to do was call on Him, and He was there for me in exactly the way I needed.

## How Devotees are Serving - by Radhe Shyam and Sitarami

Late in October, 1978, Charles Swan's wife died of the sting of a "killer bee". Charles was then heading the U.S. State Department's team that was negotiating the contract for the construction of the U.S. Embassy compound in Moscow. In December and January, the team was scheduled for visits to Moscow and Charles "advertised" at the Transcendental Meditation center for someone to house-and-cat sit while he was away. Margaret Gold answered the call. She came, he saw, she conquered. After the Moscow trips, Charles asked her to marry him. She said no.

In December, 1979, Charles retired from the State Department and planned to start an international business coordinating information on property matters from Foreign Offices around the world. He planned a January-February trip through Northern Europe to line up contracts for his business venture. Margaret was teaching a law course with specific focus on Vietnam Veterans' legal problems. Margaret planned a trip to Switzerland and India to meet Babaji. Charles helped her with money for her trip and got a promise from Margaret to meet him in London for the last part of his trip - to Paris, Bonn, and on to Israel.

When Charles got to London in February, 1980, he found two letters from Margaret. "I have met Babaji and want to stay at His lotus feet for the rest of my life. Thanks for your help in getting here." Charles extended his business trip from Tel Aviv to New Delhi, India



On February 22, 1980, Margaret met Charles in New Delhi and took him to Vrindaban, where Charles met Babaji in His ashram there. Charles had bought a golden heart-shaped locket in Paris for Babaji and after his pranam, Charles gave it to Babaji. Babaji looked unimpressed and handed it to Mahent Baba who stood beside Him. As Charles started to leave, Baba motioned for Charles to sit to His right. Charles watched Baba play with the people who knelt before Him and throw candies and fruit to the ladies and children who sat in front of Him. Charles wondered, "Is this really God on earth?" Suddenly, Baba told Charles to go talk to

Swamiji, who could answer all Charles' questions.

After two days filled with blessings, Babaji sent us both to Haidakhan, while He and His party went on to Bombay. Charles had unfinished business to handle and left India and returned to the U.S. When the work was done, uncertain as to which had the strongest pull, Charles took a plane back to India and Babaji and Margaret. After toying with Charles and Margaret for a few days, Babaji married them and gave them the names of Sitarami and Radhe Shyam. They stayed in Haidakhan with Babaji for several years.

Sitarami and Radhe Shyam are now living and working in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Sitarami still handles a few criminal defense cases, but has left a full-time law practice to head the Adoption and Foster Care office for the Three Rivers American Indian Center. This keeps her involved with both children and the law and provides more satisfaction than criminal court appearances.

She has also become involved in a group of experienced activists who are working to establish a nonprofit satellite television channel to broadcast educational programs on Native American lore and traditions to reservations and to others who are interested. The programs would reach most of the world through satellite projection. For Native Americans of both North and South America, it would be a means of preserving and instilling respect for ancient traditions, and for others it would provide learning experiences and understanding of a different culture. The group has available a huge collection of taped programs and the capacity to create others.

When Radhe Shyam returned from Voronezh, Russia, in 1996, he started working with Sitarami in her private criminal law practice. Since he is not licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania, he became involved, as a paralegal, in Sitarami's correspondence with prisoners in state and federal prisons.

Over the years, he has developed considerable sympathy and respect for inmates who do their

best to maintain and build their individual dignity and responsibility to others. And he has networked with individuals and organizations that support prisoners. Radhe Shyam found it impossible to deal with The Prison System without developing disgust and outrage for the conscious violence perpetrated on the men, women and

children thrown into our prisons. Radhe Shyam feels that there is no serious thought of rehabilitation in prisons any longer; they seem to be based on retribution and punishment - despite the fact that about 80% of inmates are eventually released into a society they have learned to fear and hate.



The work with prisoners and with people and organizations who work for reform of The System led, last October, to Radhe Shyam's incorporating in Pennsylvania a 501(c)(4) nonprofit lobbying organization to reform the prison system, the laws which relate to it, and the society which

created and supports it. Radhe Shyam calls it a foundation for the Age of Enlightenment which will follow the chaos, disorder, greed, and hatred in the world today. You will soon be able to get acquainted with THE JUSTICE LOBBY at [www.thejusticelobby.org](http://www.thejusticelobby.org).
